Parking and collection and drop off

A reminder to please make sure that you are adhering to the road markings around the local area. It has been noticed that some families are dropping their children off on the double red lines. These lines mean no stopping at all. Only a blue badge holder can drop off - no parking at all for anyone. This applies at all times even when it is quiet, for example when dropping off for squash club.

May I remind you all not to park on grassed verges, either on Long Road or The Avenue. The ground is very soft and it causes lasting damage.

Finally please make sure you only park in the accessible spaces if you have a badge for a person who is in the vehicle (will be in the vehicle). A temporary disability like a broken leg does not qualify an individual to use the accessible spaces. Thank you for your co-operation.
